Executive Summary

To maximize the outreach of STOP's final conference, it is decided to hold the conference adjacent to the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women. The conference is held at University of Granada with participation of numerous public and NGO stakeholders. The conference receives widespread media coverage, including newspapers and television. The STOP team presents outcomes from the project; this is followed by discussions with the audience about the feasibility of interventions against intimate partner violence centered around pregnancy, interventions targeted migrant women, and the potential of centering the intervention around pediatric care. The program for the event, a signed attendance list, and the presentation is attached as appendices.

2. STOP'S FINAL CONFERENCE

November 25 is the United Nation's annual International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women. As STOP's last consortium meeting took place on November 24–25, 2022, it was appropriate to arrange a dedicated dissemination seminar in conjunction with the meeting. As the timing was so close to the project's ending, the Danish and Spanish project teams decided that this event should be STOP's final conference. It was organised by the Spanish team with participation of the entire project team as well as Spanish stakeholders. Due to language barriers, it was felt that holding the event mainly in Spanish would boost participation. In Denmark, separate events have been held for the Region of Southern Denmark's obstetrical board, as well as external stakeholders (see Deliverable 1.2).

The final conference was held at the University of Granada with participants from, among others Instituto Andaluz de la Mujer, Ayuntamiento de Granada, Asociación de Psicología Feminista, midwives and gynecologists from the Andalucian public health system, the vice rector of Equality, Inclusion and Sustainability at University of Granada, and a former responsible from the Spanish government's Department of Violence Against Women.

The press office at University of Granada generated significant media attention; a regional TV station was present and later that broadcast a news clip about the results of STOP, and several newspapers covered the event as well.

Project coordinator, Vibeke Rasch, introduced the project and explained the rationale behind STOP, after which professors Stella Martín de las Heras and Jesús López Megías presented the

outcomes of STOP. This was followed by a plenary discussion session, during which the audience touched upon the following:

- It was highlighted that in Andalusía there is no proactive IPV screening. If there were, it would be necessary to specify what resources would be offered.

Administrative representatives from the Andalucian public health system unfortunately had to cancel last minute, which prevented further discussion of implementation of IPV screening in routine antenatal care in the region. Many participants agreed on the following proposal:

- **To carry out a similar project in pediatrics as women visit the consultation regularly, and the partner is less likely to attend, hence, IPV screening will be easier.**

Further, the following points were raised by the audience:

- Reflections on pregnancy as a moment of detection. Consider and address the loss of contact with the woman after pregnancy and potential additional costs.
- Desirability of having a gateway to the Instituto Andaluz de la Mujer from the health services.
- Consider that women can expect that when the baby is born the violence will end, and that this may lead women to abandon the intervention. There is under-detection, especially in pregnancy.
- Emphasis on mental health with respect to violence against women.
- Considerations as to whether it is the first pregnancy or not, and if that influences the women to continue with the intervention. Many times, in second or subsequent pregnancies it is easier

Concerning a future IPV-project, the project team is eager to focus on IPV beyond pregnancy and - as suggested during the conference - focus on IPV exposed mothers via pediatric care (when children are attending check-ups, vaccinations, etc. during their earliest years).

Finally, IPV among migrant women was debated at length:

- Future projects should also focus on migrant women; there are many migrant women who suffer different problems. Not only language barrier and not only partner violence (female genital mutilation, etc.). If we are going to continue along this line, we should also include other types of violence, not just partner violence.
- Pregnancy is also a feasible moment for detection of a human trafficking situation.
- Future projects with migrant women would need for cultural adaptation.

Regarding projects dealing with migrant women exposed to IPV, it should be noted that the STOP consortium applied for a new project focusing on this target group. While the proposal – despite a favorable evaluation – was ultimately rejected, it is very likely that University of Granada and Region of Southern Denmark will continue to seek funding for this project.



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
